Back in May, I saw a TV commercial trying to sell masks saying that they are here to stay, so we should order some. I kind of scoffed, thinking that things were back to normal. I had no plans to buy any more masks. But that was before the Delta variant had reared its ugly head and returned our hospital system to its overwhelmed status. In July, I got a phone call from the hospital here in Cleburne where I had been a volunteer chaplain, a program which was suspended when the pandemic began. I had been expecting them to tell me that the we could return to our duties, but instead, they canceled the program altogether. I don't think they would have canceled it if they thought we would be out of this in the near future. I ended up buying a box of 100 disposable masks. It looks like the times have changed for us for longer than we anticipated.

I was not surprised when the Bishop put out a video encouraging us to consider wearing masks in the sanctuary again. That is why I started wearing mine a couple of weeks ago. Today I read a post from Emily Smith, the Friendly Neighbor Epidemiologist, an epidemiologist at Baylor University and the wife of a pastor in Waco. Here is a part of what she wrote:

This post is written to my beloved town of Waco, Texas. But I would say the same things to churches/ Christians in areas with similar HIGH case rates, overwhelmed hospitals, and increased numbers of deaths all across the country - including my hometown area of Lea County, NM.

Waco churches, when is enough enough? It is unfaithful, as Christians, at this point to not wear a mask in a church service with numbers like this (go here for more on that: <u>https://emilysmith.substack.com/p/delta-and-church</u>).

For a year now, loving your neighbors has meant requiring masks in your sanctuaries at all times. But it is more evident now with numbers like these. This is my personal plea to you. Pastors, we need you to lead.

Letting masking be a personal choice for your congregants misses the point of the Cross that, 2000 years ago, stripped our personal choices and gave us Jesus, a whole new way to define who our "neighbor" is, and a whole new way to define freedom - one that lives out and reflects what Jesus showed us in Philippians 2:5-11 - with humility, considering others better than ourselves, being a servant. Not a usurped "freedom" that was individual. But a true freedom that reflects holiness and Who lives in us.

Her understanding of the cross is one that I have come to have over the last few years. We may be justified by Christ's death on the cross, but we are sanctified by our taking up our cross and following Christ. To paraphrase Galatians 2:20: We are crucified with Christ, therefore we no longer live, Jesus Christ now lives in us. Jesus is Lord. May we live like we truly believe it.

While I have not called upon the church council to consider requiring masks again, I do encourage all of us to wear them during worship on Sunday mornings. I hate wearing them as much as anyone, but I love all of you more than I hate wearing them.
